

**ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONERS COURT
OF FANNIN COUNTY, TEXAS
DESIGNATING ROAD
CLOSURES**

MAY 11, 2021

WHEREAS, Section 251.016 of the Texas Transportation Code states that the Fannin County Commissioners Court may exercise general control over all roads, highways, and bridges in Fannin County; and

WHEREAS, Section 251.051 of the Texas Transportation Code allows the Fannin County Commissioners Court to order public roads to be closed, abandoned, altered, or vacated; and

WHEREAS, Section 251.052 of the Texas Transportation Code allows the residents of a Fannin County precinct to apply for a change in an existing road by presenting to the Fannin County Commissioners a petition requesting such a change to an existing road; and

WHEREAS, the Upper Trinity Regional Water District ("UTRWD") is developing a water supply reservoir in North Sulphur River Basin in Fannin County, Texas, which is named "Lake Ralph Hall"; and,

WHEREAS, Lake Ralph Hall will be impounded approximately 16 miles southeast of Bonham, and adjacent to the north side of Ladonia, Fannin County Texas; and,

WHEREAS, UTRWD and Fannin County entered into that certain Agreement between Upper Trinity Regional Water District and Fannin County, Texas concerning Development of the Proposed Lake Ralph Hall Project on or about March 24, 2008 ("Agreement"), relating to UTRWD's and Fannin County's cooperation in the development of Lake Ralph Hall; and,

WHEREAS, Section 4 (Actions in Support of County Roads/Transportation Infrastructure) of the Agreement specifies that the District will coordinate with both Fannin County and Texas Department of Transportation (TX DOT) concerning reasonable and necessary adjustments in the existing road system to accommodate development of the Lake; and,

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2021, UTRWD did award a construction contract for the Leon Hurse Dam signaling the first major construction project related to Lake Ralph Hall; and,

WHEREAS, there are four (4) County roads impacted by the Leon Hurse Dam project requiring closure; and,

WHEREAS, there is one (1) County road in the vicinity of the Lake Ralph Hall Project that is not impacted by the Project but the adjacent landowners have requested that it be closed; and,

WHEREAS, residents/property owners of Fannin County impacted by the proposed road

closures signed individual petitions requesting their closure, and all closures were posted on-site and the Fannin County Courthouse for the required 20-day notice period; and,

WHEREAS , the Fannin County Commissioners Court finds the statutory notice provisions in Chapter 251 of the Texas Government Code have been satisfied, that to the extent required, replacement roads have been designated and readied, and hereby closes, alters, vacates, and terminates the roads and bridges, or portions thereof, as identified in this Order.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED BY THE FANNIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT ON MAY 11, 2021, THAT:

The following roads and bridges, or portions thereof, are closed, vacated, and terminated:

Precinct 3 Road Closures

1. CR 3605 beginning at FM 1550 and extending south to its current dead end, a closure approximately 0.62 miles (3,287 feet) in length.
2. CR 3610 beginning at FM 1550 and extending south to its current dead end, a closure approximately 2.36 miles (12,461 feet) in length.
3. CR 3640 beginning at the western edge of UTRWD-owned FCAD Tract # 109377 eastward to its current dead end, a closure approximately 0.60 miles (3,178 feet) in length.
4. CR 3645 beginning at its intersection with County Road 3640, south to a point at the north end of the Fields Tract being approximately 3,342' north of FM 64, a closure approximately 0.30 miles (1,578 feet) in length.
5. CR 3375 from FM 1550 to approximately 3,300 feet west of SH 34, being at the eastern boundary of Fannin County Appraisal District Parcel ID # 83806, a closure approximately 0.41 miles (2,150 feet) in length.


