On the 23rd day of Nov. 1987 the Fannin County Commissioners' Court met in Special Session with the following members being present:

- Jimmy Doyle , County Judge, Presiding,
- Derrell Hall, Commissioner Precinct One,
- Lloyd Flanagan, Commissioner Precinct Two,
- A. D. McBurnett, Commissioner Precinct Three,
- Choice Wilson, Commissioner, Precinct Four.

The following business was transacted to-wit:

Commissioner Hall gave the invocation.

Fred Boyd, Teen Challenge representative presented their program for public knowledge.

Court discussed donations to Texoma Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Comm. Wilson moved the county donate \$750.00 , seconded by Comm. Hall. Comm. Wilson voted aye, Comm. Hall voted aye, Comm. Flanagan voted aye. Comm. McBurnett abstained.

Court discussed a contract to collect delinquent taxes for the county. Gates Steens had a contract before the court. Presentations were made by Jim Porter for Perdue, Brandon & Fielder, James Moss introduced R. J. Hagood who made a presentation. Court discussed these. A. D. McBurnett made the motion to hire Gates Steen, seconded by Comm. Flanagan. Comm. Flanagan voted aye, Comm. McBurnett voted aye. Comm. Wilson voted nay, Comm. Hall voted nay. Judge Doyle stated he would have to go with Mr. Hagood and there fore was voting nay. Motion did not carry. Comm. Wilson moved the county employ R. J. Hagood, seconded by Comm. Hall. Comm. Wilson voted aye, Comm. Hall voted aye, Comm. Flanagan abstained, Comm. McBurnett abstained , Judge Doyle voted aye. Motion carried.

Comm. Flanagan moved Derrell Hall be reappointed to the Juvenile Board, seconded by Comm. Wilson. All voted aye. VOL. 3 PAGE 419

Bids were opened to pave the parking lot at the jail building. Ten bids were received. Halls \$8,322.00, Delbert Day \$8,964.00, Hasty Bros. \$23,750.00, Austin, \$8,370.00, Schuster & Walker \$6,912.00, Ambrose Const. \$8,100.00, Larry Ross \$8,960.00, Forward Corp. \$8,640.00, A & W. Supply \$9,275.00, and Crockham & Vessels \$7,805.00. MC Burnett moved the bid of Schuster & Walker be accepted, seconded by Comm. Flanagan. Comm. Hall abstained, Comm. Wilson voted aye, Comm. Flanagan voted aye, Comm. McBurnett

voted aye. Bids shown attached.

The court discussed liability insurance for county officials but agreed to pass until the next meeting.

Comm. Hall moved the bills be paid as presented, seconded by Comm. Wilson. All voted aye. Shown attached.


Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written by motion of Comm. Wilson, seconded by Comm. Hall. All voted aye.

A public hearing was held on adopting a junk yard ordinance for the county. Judge Doyle ask if any one was present to object to the adoption. John Skotnik stated he represented a client who had a concern about the ordinance but they felt as the court presented it they had no objections. Comm. Wilson moved the county adopt the ordinance , seconded by Comm. McBurnett. All voted aye. Shown attached.

The court discussed paying subsidy to ambulance services in the county. It was agreed to table the matter until the next meeting.


The court considered the constitutional amendment that exempts boats, aircraft, and recreational vehicles from ad valorem taxation. Under the new amendment, counties are allowed to continue to tax this exempted property if passed by the commissioners' court. Comm. Flanagan moved the court pass a resolution to tax the above items, seconded by Comm. Hall. All voted aye.

RESOLUTION

RE:

S.B. 177

At the regular meeting of Commissioners' Court of Fannin County, Texas, on the 23 day of November, 1987, the Court considered the contents of Senate Bill 177, being legislation relating to screening of wrecking yards operated in counties in Texas but not in incorporated cities; the Court being unanimously in the opinion that this bill is in the best interest of the County.

WHEREAS, the County will have limited authority to regulate wrecking yards inside the corporate limits of Fannin County but not in the incorporated areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, S.B. 177 gives the County ordinance making powers to regulate the screening of such wrecking yards or junk yards; and

WHEREAS, public hearings were held in accordance with Senate Bill 177, 70th Legislative Session of the State of Texas:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commissioners' Court of Fannin County, Texas do adopt the attached Ordinance pertaining to Senate bill 177.
